SECRETARY'S NEWS EILEEN SLECKMAN, DP

On May 29th I represented the New York Department of the DUVCW at a ceremony in Greenpoint, Brooklyn where the Monitor Trail Marker was unveiled by George J. Weinmann of the SUVCW Oliver Tilden Camp #26 and David Alberg of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration. This northernmost portion of the trail will link the historic sites of the Monitor to those in Virginia and North Carolina and marks the very spot where the U.S.S. Monitor was launched 153 years ago, also the site for the planned Monitor Museum.

The ceremony featured speeches from several local politicians; Mr. Alberg from NOAA, which is involved in constructing the trail, Midshipmen from Kings Point Merchant Marine Academy, and children from PS 110's chorus singing the National Anthem. Civil War era music was also performed by Arthur Kirmss of the Oliver Tilden Camp.



The dramatic moment of the unveiling coincided with the arrival of New York City fireboat 343, which proceeded to fire a water cannon salute. The fireboat is named for the 343 New York City firefighters who lost their lives in the line of duty on 9/11/2001. As the Trail Marker is directly across from the Freedom Tower in lower Manhattan, it is a site that has great emotional resonance. The ceremony

concluded with a Civil War Gun Salute and retiring of the Colors.


After the ceremony we continued on to the nearby Brooklyn Expo Center, where participants and visitors enjoyed the many displays and presentations throughout the day.
