

LINCMO CARILLON DONATION

On December 13th, 2015, Kady Brownell Tent #36 made an inaugural donation of \$100 toward the repair of the electronic carillon at Long Island National Cemetery in Farmingdale. Originally dedicated on May 27, 1962, and purchased with funds raised by Veterans organizations in Nassau and Suffolk counties, the carillon has not worked for the past seven or eight years, and it has been greatly missed. Although it has not

been definitively decided whether to replace the carillon with a digital version or to repair it using parts that would be specially made, it was felt that it was important to draw attention to and begin raising funds for this cause.

The cost of repair is estimated to be \$13,000; replacement would be \$15,000. The carillon, when operational, is also connected to an organ that can be played live or programed to play music automatically, often using a timer. The sound, which simulates chimes, is projected via a speaker tower on the cemetery grounds.

In 1949 Arlington National Cemetery was the first national cemetery to have a carillon installed and dedicated by President Harry S. Truman, who said: "As these bells ring... honored dead rest... freedom lives." Conceived as a "Living Memorial," the carillon delivers the beautiful sound of bells as a tribute to both sacrifice and service. They continue to be installed at Veterans facilities across the nation.

The Long Island National Cemetery Memorial Organization (LINCMO), of which the DUVCW is an honorary member, meets the second Sunday of every month at 11:30 a.m. at the cemetery office. Its mission is to work with all veterans groups to ensure that the cemetery is cared for and to organize/attend services throughout the year.

REMEMBRANCE WEEKEND 2015

Members of the DUVCW, SUVCW and ASUVCW (Auxiliary to the Sons) assembled at the New York State Memorial in the National Cemetery at Gettysburg, November 21, 2015 for this photo. In attendance was our National President Sally Redinger and our Past National President Ellen Higgins. Remembrance Day commemorates the Gettysburg Address and the establishment of the Soldiers National Cemetery following the Battle of Gettysburg in 1863. Earlier in the day we all marched in the parade through the town of Gettysburg in authentic dress and then met at the monument for a ceremony honoring two of our members who are also veterans. As it grew dark the cemetery was beautifully lit for the annual illumination ceremony.

A trip to Gettysburg is a must for any Civil War buff. The National Parks Service has been working at returning the site to the condition it was in at the time of the battle, and any post Civil War buildings have been or are being gradually removed. It really is like stepping back in time; the silence of the battlefield filled with monuments is an inspiration. Each year on Remembrance Weekend, the park and the town is filled with the music and color of living historians. For many it is an opportunity to honor an ancestor and an event that profoundly
